Procedure for Election of At- Large Members (POP Manual)

Procedures for Election of At-Large Members

1. Based on region areas (multiple sections), candidates will be grouped as follows:
 - Region A - Sections I-II-III
 - Region B - Sections IV-V
 - Region C - Sections VI-VII-VIII
2. Each section will screen and subsequently elect one candidate.
3. Every state is eligible to nominate an at-large candidate except those states represented by a section board member whose section board term will overlap the term of the at-large candidate.
4. As terms expire, the affected region would again nominate one at-large candidate per section for the Board of Directors, with the NIAAA members in attendance at the national conference then electing a candidate for a full three-year term.
5. Candidates are placed in nomination during a section meeting.
6. A section may not nominate a candidate who has previously served on the Board of Directors.
7. If any current member of the Credentials Committee runs for an at-large board position, he/she shall remove themselves from any committee election procedure.

Jim Teff Achievement Recognition for Professional Development

Each year at the July board meeting, the NIAAA Board of Directors will select **one** State Coordinator (either Certification or LTI) who developed and implemented a new initiative in their state in the area of professional development during the previous school year. This initiative must be innovative, must be recognized nationally as a best practice and must have benefited the athletic administrators in that state or nationally. Nominations may be submitted by individual NIAAA members or state association boards and must be received in the NIAAA office by July 1 for consideration.

- a. Recipient will receive a \$1,000 scholarship to assist with expenses to attend the national conference
- b. Recipient's state will receive scholarships for three individuals to each take one complimentary course taught in that state

This award does not have to be selected each year. Funding for this recognition will come from the Jim Teff Professional Development Memorial Fund established by the NIAAA Board of Directors for the express purpose of this recognition.

Contributions so designated for this memorial should be sent to the NIAAA office.

At such time that the resources in the memorial fund have been exhausted, it shall be the discretion of the Board of Directors whether to continue to fund this recognition or discontinue the recognition.
